Community Workshops: Join us for Important Updates and Future Planning!

We are excited to announce two upcoming community workshops where we will share important updates on projects, budget goals, and initiatives that will shape the future of our city. We invite all residents to

attend and contribute to these discussions, as your input is crucial in ensuring we move forward together toward a brighter future.

Workshop 1: March 12th - Project Updates & Stormwater Management

Our first workshop will focus on completed and upcoming projects within our city, including key infrastructure improvements and initiatives that directly impact the community. We will also dive into an important issue affecting our environment and daily lives: **Stormwater Management**.

Stormwater is water that comes from rain, and it can have a significant impact on our environment if not properly managed. It can contribute to flooding, erosion, and pollution of our water systems. During this workshop, we will explain how we're addressing stormwater in our city, the methods being used to manage it effectively, and why these efforts are vital for long-term sustainability. The city is mandated by regulations to complete certain aspects of stormwater projects by a certain time. We will go into those regulations, why they are important and where the city stands currently with reaching the goal the state has set.

Additionally, we will present updates on the progress of various projects that have been completed and those that are on the horizon. Your questions and feedback will be welcomed as we discuss how these projects benefit our community.

<u>Workshop 2: April 23rd - Homestead Exemption, Budget</u> <u>Planning, and Community Priorities</u>

In our second workshop, we will cover several important topics that directly affect resident's day-to-day lives:

Homestead Exemption

We will discuss the additional **Homestead Exemption** aimed at helping homeowners in our city save money on property taxes. This exemption will provide savings for qualifying homeowners, and we will explain how it works and how it benefits residents.

• The Importance of the Budget

The city's budget is a vital document that determines how resources are allocated to public services, infrastructure projects, and community programs. We will present the **goals**

for the upcoming budget year, outlining how we plan to prioritize funding for various city needs. This budget directly impacts the quality of services such as police, fire, public works, and recreation.

A key discussion point will be **millage rates**, which play a crucial role in determining the amount of property tax collected to fund these services. We'll explain how the millage rate affects your property taxes and how it aligns with the city's revenue needs.

• Employee Salaries and Benefits

A significant portion of the city's budget is dedicated to our **employees**, including police, fire, public works, recreation and support staff. We will discuss proposed changes to **employee salaries and benefits**, ensuring that our city can attract and retain talented individuals who provide essential services to the community. Fair compensation is key to maintaining a high level of service, so we want to hear your thoughts on how we can support our workforce while balancing budgetary constraints.

Why Your Input Matters

Both workshops are an opportunity for you to have a direct impact on the future of our city. As we discuss important projects, stormwater management, and the budget, we want to know what you care about most. The budget is not just about numbers - it's about how we allocate resources to support the quality of life in our community. Your input on where funding should be focused, how millage rates should be set, and how we support our city employees will guide our decisions in the months ahead.



Making Our City Beautiful and Sustainable

The City of Satellite Beach Tree & Beautification Board spent Saturday, January 4 planting and clearing sections at the Municipal Building. As part of its beautification efforts, the plantings are focused on native species that are better for our local environment and also easier to maintain. All board members were present, and the group is organizing additional planting days. The NEW Tree & Beautification Board has numerous responsibilities that stem from the City of Satellite Beach's Tree Grant. This Grant allows the City to initiate an urban tree management program to protect and increase the existing tree canopy. To comply with the requirements of the grant we must also be part of "Tree City USA", which has the following requirements:

- Maintaining a Tree Board or department
- Having a community tree ordinance
- Spending at least \$2 per capita on urban forestry
- Celebrating Arbor Day

The Tree & Beautification Board consists of Nicolle Boujaber - Chair, Sondra Cappuccio Vail - Vice Chair, Sandy Grutta, Richard Pectol, Jessica Kochman, Lars Jones, and Beth Rieder. The Board also participated in Arbor Day on January 18th by giving away free trees and promoting the City of Satellite Beach's license plates, magnets, and decals. Multiple vendors participated in this day. Two trees were planted in honor of Frank Catino and Don Moore. The Tree & Beautification Board will be participating in several upcoming events, including Yard of the Month, the Sea Turtle Lighting Workshop on March 8th, Gopher Tortoise Day on April 10th, and multiple planting days.

Important Safety Reminder: Proper Disposal of Hazardous Materials

Residents are reminded that propane gas containers, regardless of size, are considered hazardous waste and must not be disposed of in regular trash. These tanks, if improperly handled, can cause fires or explosions, posing a serious risk to Waste Management drivers, surrounding neighborhoods, and the community.

We have received several reports of residents being unable to return used propane tanks to retailers such as Lowe's or hardware stores, and some have resorted to disposing of them in the trash. This is extremely dangerous!

For safe disposal, propane tanks, as well as other hazardous items like batteries, can be dropped off at Waste Management's facility (3379 Sarno Road) Melbourne. Please do your part to help maintain a safe environment by properly disposing of these items. Unfortunately, Satellite Beach is not currently offering a drop-off location for these items, and the Fire Department is not accepting them at this time. For now, please make use of the Sarno Road location.



FRIENDLY REMINDER

districts: (b) Maintenance (1) Landscaping shall be maintained in a neat and attractive manner and shall meet the following standards: a. Landscaping shall be healthy and free of weeds, refuse, debris and pests. b. Grass and weeds shall be no higher than six inches on improved lots, except that native grasses in landscapes and publicly owned conservation areas do not need to be cut as long as they are healthy, free of pest, weeds and do

not constitute a fire hazard.

Beach Parking Reminder - Changes Effective February 1, 2025:

Effective February 1st, Park Satellite Beach ushered in its citation program, eliminating the use of boots and implementing a citation-only enforcement system.

Key Changes to the program include:

- Daily Parking Violation: If a vehicle fails to pay for daily parking and does not have a valid pass, the registered owner will receive a \$60 citation (\$10 all-day parking fee + \$50 fine). If unpaid after 30 days, the fine increases to \$100.
- Safety Violation: If a vehicle commits a safety violation, the registered owner will receive a \$70 citation (\$10 all-day parking fee + \$60 fine). If unpaid after 30 days, the fine increases to \$120.
- <u>Unpaid Citations</u>: Outstanding fines will be sent to the State of Florida, preventing renewal of vehicle tags until paid.

Parking Permit Updates:


- Satellite Beach Residents who have registered for a Beach Parking Pass are valid through December 2026.
- Non-Resident Permits for Pelican Beach and Hightower Park East follow a calendar year renewal process. If a non-resident permit has not been renewed, your renewal period has closed, and your pass has expired. You will need to reapply for a calendar year Beach Parking Pass, by visiting www.parksatellitebeach.org.

CITY INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECT UPDATES



PROJECT STATUS

- The South Basin Stormwater Improvements project is complete. The project saw the construction of various best management practices (BMPs) to improve water quality in discharges to the lagoon. Treatment swales and a retention area were constructed throughout the southern region of the city, and a nutrient filtration box was installed at the Sports Park. New stormwater pipes were installed to replace failing pipes along Rosada Street.
- Floating wetlands were installed in the City Hall pond. These are designed to remove nutrients from the water prior to discharge into the lagoon. The City Hall wall is also complete.
- The **Roosevelt Baffle Box**, a new-generation nutrient and debris filtration device, is nearing completion.
- The Jackson Avenue Streetscape project has begun.
- Road resurfacing will be occurring at Delaura Middle School during school break, with a window of 3/14-3/23. Resurfacing of concrete roads throughout the city is still in progress.



Satellite Beach Police Department Volunteer Spotlight: Al Dodds

Al Dodds is a volunteer with the Satellite Beach Police Department who has seen and done more than most could ever imagine. Since 2022, he has dedicated his time and efforts to the Citizens on Patrol (C.O.P.) and Beach ATV programs. His volunteer role is straightforward, but essential, serving as an extra set of eyes and ears for local law enforcement, helping with house checks, and supporting community events like the Founder's Day Parade and 5K races.

But Al's story stretches far beyond these local volunteer efforts. A military veteran, Al served in Vietnam as a K-9 sentry dog handler. His journey as a K-9 handler, however, didn't stop there. After serving in the military, Al and his dog, Tess, volunteered to assist law enforcement agencies in finding human remains, working on several cases with the St. Johns County Sheriff's Office. During this time, Al realized that law enforcement typically uses their own K-9s, and Tess had unique skills that were too valuable to be overlooked. When Al discovered the military's growing need for dogs to search for human remains, he and Tess underwent the necessary training and certification to maximize her talents.

In 2007, Al took a leave of absence from his role as the band director at St. Augustine High School to answer another call for service—this time in Iraq. Al and Tess were deployed, working with a private company contracted by the U.S. military to search

for the remains of American soldiers missing in action. Together, they not only helped recover fallen soldiers but also uncovered mass graves, providing much-needed closure to families affected by the war. Tess' exceptional work earned her the U.S. War Dogs Association's War Dog Medal. Sadly, Tess passed away in 2012 at the age of 12. Al reflected, "She had a good, full life and put me all through the world. We saw 17 states and eight countries together. Some of those were just stops at the airport, but we were there."

Upon returning home in March 2008, Al retired from the St. Johns County School District and relocated to Satellite Beach. In 2009, he began teaching as the orchestra director at DeLaura Middle School. Now officially retired, Al hasn't slowed down much. An accomplished musician, you can find him playing bass with the Ron Teixeira Trio at Heidi's Jazz Club in Cocoa Beach. He continues to contribute to his community and remains an invaluable member of the Satellite Beach Police Department's volunteer team.

Al Dodds' life is a testament to service—whether in the military, as a dedicated volunteer, or through his ongoing contributions to the community. His impact, both near and far, is a lasting legacy of dedication and selflessness.



Doug was born in Indiana, PA and moved to Akron, OH at the age of 8. At 17, he was awarded his Eagle Scout badge for various

environmental projects he spearheaded. Doug graduated from Garfield High School in 1959 and the very next day, enlisted in the Air Force. Basic training was conducted at Lakland AFB followed by technical training in Wichita Falls, TX as an Aerial Refueling Boom Operator. In 1961, Airman Cresanta was assigned to the 380th AR Squadron; Plattsburg AFB, NY (KC-97 G/F aircraft)which included a one-year deployment to Goose Bay, Labrador, Canada for standby alert duty. His next duty station was Blytheville AFB, AR with the 97th AR Squadron. A1C Cresanta was discharged from the USAF in Jun 1963. Doug enjoyed being in the aviation business, so he enrolled at Northrop Institute of Technology in Los Angeles to pursue certification as an Airframe and Power Plant Mechanic. Doug graduated top of his class in 1965. For the next 18 years, he was employed by TWA at LAX (1 yr)and then Albuquerque International Airport, NM. During those years, Doug worked on such aircraft as the Convair 880, Boeing 707 and 747. In 1980, he accepted a position with TWA for a 3-year contract to support transit flight operations at Jedda Airport (King Abdulaziz International Airport) Saudi Arabia. Doug returned to the United States in 1983 and was hired by Peoples Express Airlines as a Maintenance Manager in Newark, NJ. When PE Airlines purchased their first 747, management selected Doug to become a Flight Engineer because of his extensive experience with the 747. PE merged with Continental Airlines in 1987, and Doug continued working as a FE and a 747 systems instructor until 1997. His next opportunity came with Gemini Air Cargo where he flew as a FE aboard DC-10-30 aircraft. In 2003, the Department of Defense activated the Civil Reserve Air Fleet to support Logistical Resupply missions into Iraq and Afghanistan. Doug participated in a dozen or so missions flying into and out of Baghdad and Bagram Airports. The USAF acknowledged their dedicated support by awarding crews with the Aerial Achievement Medal. Doug retired and moved to Satellite Beach
